National Gallery and Museum of Wales

- **Exhibition: Winifred Coombe Tennant: A life through art** (on loan from the National Library of Wales. An exhibition of works from the collection of the suffragette, political activist, spiritual medium and one of Wales' most significant art patrons of the twentieth century: Winifred Coombe Tennant (1874-1956). The exhibition is curated by Peter Lord and includes works by Evan Walters, Kyffin Williams, Gwen John and John Elwyn from both private and public collections.
- The new archeological exhibition, **'Origins: In Search of Early Wales'** explores the origins of, from the arrival of the first hominins (humans) in the Old Stone Age to the end of the Middle Ages.
